Pronouns	Used in place of nouns to avoid repeating them e.g. I read a book. e.g. She kicked him. e.g. They got told off.
Types of Sentence Statement, Question, Exclamation, Command	e.g. Here is some cheese e.g. Can I have some cheese? e.g. This cheese is disgusting! e.g. Get me some cheese.
Subordinate Clause	A clause that won't make sense on its own. e.g. The cat ran away when the dog barked.
Singular & Plural	One or more than one e.g. brush / brushes child / children pony / ponies
Past tense	When something has already happened e.g. I walk <mark>ed</mark> to the hospital.

Proper Nouns	Nouns with a real name e.g. <mark>Sarah, Monday, April</mark> , <mark>England</mark>
Common Nouns	A person, place or thing e.g. <mark>table</mark> , ship, book, chair
Prefixes	Letters at the start of a word e.g. un happy, <mark>sub</mark> marine, <mark>tri</mark> cycle
Adverbs	Tells how, when or where a verb happens e.g. I ate my dinner <mark>quickly</mark> . e.g. Later , they went to the park. e.g. The plane flew high.
Future tense	When something hasn't happened yet e.g. I <mark>will play</mark> football tomorrow.
Commas	Used for lists or to separate clauses e.g. The blue, pink, orange and green umbrella. e.g. Trembling with fear, the soldier approached the trench.
Subordinating Conjunctions	Join two unequal clauses e.g. I ate my dinner <mark>because</mark> I was hungry. e.g. I laughed at my brother while he was crying.

Prepositions	Relationship of a noun to other words e.g. boxes in the cupboard path around the park
Inverted Commas	Show when someone is speaking e.g. "I need to go," said Fred.
Suffixes	Letters added to the end of a word e.g. jumping, happiness, beautiful
Progressive tense	Verbs end with 'ing' e.g. I <mark>am walking</mark> , he <mark>was running</mark>
Verbs	Doing, having or being e.g. I said, I had, I was
Adjectives	Describe nouns e.g. a <mark>tall</mark> man, a <mark>beautiful</mark> flower
Clause	Part of a sentence that contains a verb e.g. After I washed my hands

Apostrophes	Used for contraction or possession e.g. can't, children's
Capital Letters	Beginning of sentences & Proper nouns e.g. Saturday, Mr Aylott
Coordinating Conjunctions	Join equal clauses e.g. <mark>and, so, but, or</mark> (ASBO)
Contractions	Shortened word with an apostrophe e.g. I'm, he's, wouldn't
Expanded Noun Phrase	Adding description to a noun e.g. an old, dusty book with ripped pages
